## **CSVT Update for Upcoming Week**

**Montoursville**, **PA** – Work is progressing on the Northern Section of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties as follows:

#### Winfield Interchange:

Traffic is open to two lanes of traffic in both direction on Route 15. Hower, Route 15 southbound will be restricted to a single lane during daylight hours so the contractor can work on the abutment for the permanent bridge spanning the highway. These conditions will remain in place through the winter.

The contractor will haul fill over the temporary bridge spanning the highway. Drainage work is ongoing.

There will be short-term lane closures in both directions for intermittent work. This work will be infrequent and for short durations. Motorists should be alert and watch for slow-moving vehicles.

### **Northumberland County:**

There will be single lane closures under daylight flagging on Route 147 so trucks can haul material from the north side of the existing bridge over Chillisquaque Creek to the south side of the bridge, as well as to construct a temporary crossover to the new northbound bridge.

Motorists should expect delays and watch for slow-moving vehicles.

#### River Bridge:

Construction of Piers 1 through 8 continues on the west side of the river. Pier stems are being constructed on Piers 1, 2, 3, and 7. Caps are being constructed on Piers 6 and 8. Pier 4 is completed and Pier 5 will be completed this week.

Work continues on the abutment on the east side of the river.
