CSVT Update

Montoursville, PA – Construction of the Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation (CSVT) project in Northumberland, Union and Snyder counties continues.

Traffic Alert

Motorists are advised of a long-term lane restriction beginning next week on Route 15 northbound and southbound. Starting Monday, April 25, motorists can expect the left (passing) lane to be restricted in both directions between Grangers Road and Route 304 in Union Township, Union County. Motorists should be alert, slow down, watch for lane changes, and drive with caution through the work zone.

Other Construction Updates

Construction activities continue on both sides of the River Bridge. The contractor, New Enterprise Stone and Lime Co., Inc., will continue paving of the new roadway, building a traffic island and turn lane, as well as miscellaneous construction activities.
